## Foundation IB subject offerings

Towards the end of the academic year, Dover Campus students complete a one week Service Project in Singapore.

### Languages other than English

Students select one additional language, based on their level of attainment. The School Supported Self-Taught Language option is for students who wish to pursue studies in their mother tongue in the IB Diploma, but for whom there is no taught course available. Please refer to our Languages at UWCSEA factsheet for more information. Some home languages are offered as non-examined small-group, after school classes at an additional charge.

If none of the offered languages are suitable please contact Admissions to discuss available options.

### Progression into Grade 11

Students who display a commitment to the values of the College and have actively participated in all elements of the learning programme are welcome to join Grade 11. The transition process relies upon an open partnership between students, parents and the school, in which the best educational interest of the student is of paramount importance.

### Assessment

Internal examinations are held at the end of the FIB year to provide students with grounding in study and examination practice. Individualised guidance is provided to all students by academic subject staff as well as their mentor after these examinations in order to prepare students for the requirements of Grade 11 and 12.

### Languages other than English

Students select a language based on their level of attainment. Language classes are offered when there are sufficient numbers to run a class. The School Supported Self-Taught Language option is intended to prepare students who intend to pursue studies in their home language (mother tongue) in the IBDP but for whom there is no taught course available. There is a small additional charge. These classes are available subject to demand. See our Languages factsheet for more information.
